Based on a true story, the film depicts a group of London based gay and lesbian activists who raised money to support the families of miners during the British miners' strike of 1984. Identifying a mining village in Wales, they set off to make their donation in person, resulting in an alliance between the two communities. The film was nominated for three BAFTAs and a Golden Globe Award. Philip Jones Griffiths Ffotograffydd Rhyfel Fietnam (Vietnam War Photographer): 2016, 50 minutes, biography/documentary, Welsh with English subtitles, includes graphic scenes.

When Philip Jones Griffiths' *Vietnam Inc.* was published in 1971, it changed the way we look at the world and was crucial in changing public attitudes in the United States. This profile of a photographer as witness rather than observer is seen through the images he captured in Vietnam in the late 1960s. It remains "one of the most detailed surveys of any conflict. Gwrthryfel Gwent: Stori'r Siartwyr (The Gwent Rebellion: The Story of the Chartists): 2014,

55 minutes documentary, Welsh with English subtitles. Historian Dr. Elin Jones follows the story of the ordinary Welsh workers who took a stance for democracy. On November 4, 1839, in Newport, the last armed rebellion against authority took place on British soil, when up to 7,000 Chartist supporters, including a large number of miners and ironworkers, marched into the town intending to release fellow protesters who had been imprisoned at the Westgate Hotel. During the protest 22 people were killed when soldiers started firing at them. The leaders were later charged with treason and exiled overseas.
